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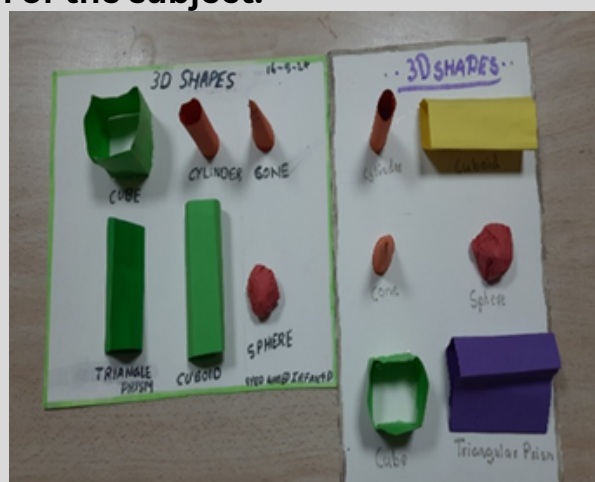
U A E CULTURAL AWARENESS DAY

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STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTION

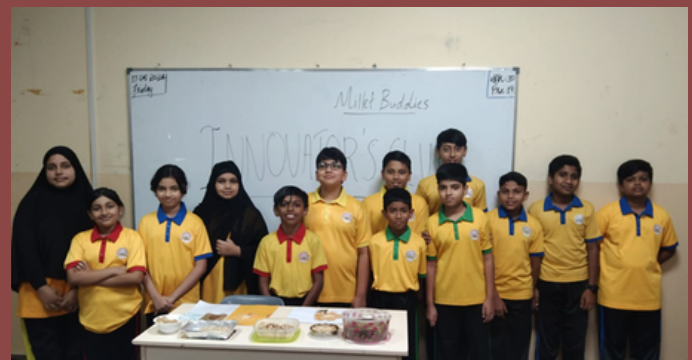
